The Crew of Blenheim Bomber Ser. No T2435 of 139 Squadron based at Horsham St.Faith, Norwich who lost their lives on the 22^{no} January 1941.

Airborne at 1020 hours from Horsham St.Faith. On return, after completing their bombing raid over NW Germany. they crossed the East Anglia coast at 1220 hours, the crew failed to give any recognition signals and the Blenheim was promptly engaged by AA fire from naval ships. Shortly afterwards the tail assembly broke away and the Blenheim dived into a field 250 yards from the Police House at Oulton. 2 miles WNW of Lowestoft, Suffolk.
